Dear Mr. Garrett:

It is a pleasure to advise you that this office has approved Tennessee's Project No. 41-00065, Red Bank City Park Development, for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance up to \$70,175. The project was submitted to us on November 19, 1969. Enclosed is a copy of the approved project agreement.

Allowing the inclusion of the amphitheater came only after considerable discussion with members of my staff. Due to the low cost, the proposed usage, the woodland setting and the relationship of this facility to the overall development, we decided this item was eligible for Fund assistance. It will continue to be our policy to closely appraise the relationship of amphitheaters to the overall park design and their contributions to outdoor recreation activities.

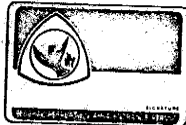
