

Red Bank, Tennessee Public Parks and Green Spaces

Stringer's Ridge Park (92 acres total; Red Bank's portion is 33.33 acres)

This 92-acre wilderness park straddling the Red Bank/Chattanooga border is a prized area of scenic, wooded hills with spectacular views overlooking the Tennessee River and Downtown. The park – protected from development and preserved by dedicated private/public partnerships – opened to the public in 2013.



This minimally developed park features an intricate network of hiking and biking trails, suitable for beginner to advanced users. The only public access points with parking are located in Chattanooga. There is no direct public access to Stringer's Ridge Park from Red Bank, although a 0.85-mile connector trail is in development from White Oak Park.
